Michele Muise had a successful career in management until downsizing left her jobless. She headed back to school at Montgomery College and is in her second year studying communications. Eunita Simmons, a 30-year Hodgkin's disease survivor who returned to school, earns her Montgomery College Associate degree this semester and next semester heads to University of Maryland University College to continue her communications studies.

At Montgomery College Foundation's annual Scholarship Recognition Luncheon in March, branch president Dian Belanger met Smith and Simmons. "Grateful and endearing," Dian described them, and "highly impressed by AAUW." We branch members hope our winners can squeeze the branch May lunch into their busy schedules, so we all can meet them.
