Don't Miss: AAUW Lobby Day on Capitol Hill

AAUW National Convention Washington, DC, 14-15 June 2017

Thanks to the persistence of AAUW Maryland president, Eileen Menton, AAUW has granted special permission for up to 50 Maryland members to participate in Lobby Day on Capitol Hill without registering for the national convention in Washington in June.

This is a fantastic opportunity to be part of something big, and oh so urgent. A huge contingent of convention-goers, and you, will "storm" the Hill to persuade Members of Congress to vote our way on an issue (not yet announced) of particular importance to AAUW, that is, to us, as women—presumably a specific bill under active consideration at the time. Being a volunteer advocate, representing so many women across the country and in our state, is empowering and powerful, especially when we're about a thousand-strong on a single day.

You will go forth informed, prepared, trained, and guided by experienced AAUW lobbyists—on the bill and the broader issue's background and progress, on how to speak effectively from provided talking points, how to conduct yourself as an AAUW representative, how to record and report back what you learn, how to navigate among the congressional office buildings. AAUW has a well-earned reputation for informed, reasoned, nonpartisan persuasion, and AAUW staff and Lobby Corps of area members do a great job of organizing and assisting.

If you say Yes, the following are mandatory:

- Attend <u>training</u>, Wednesday, 14 June, 1:30-4 pm, at the Renaissance Hotel, 999 9th Street NW, DC. Gallery Place Metro is closest.
- Attend briefing, Thursday, 15 June, 8-9 am, Renaissance Hotel.
- <u>Lobby</u> our two Senators in the morning and one Representative in the afternoon, Thursday, 15 June, according to prearranged appointments.

Lobby Day goes from 9 am to 3 pm. Buses will run to accommodate the timing of the earliest and latest appointments.

Whether you participate in Lobby Day or not, could you provide bed and breakfast to a sister Marylander or more who live beyond reasonable commuting distance? Please notify Eileen.
